

In 1999, she made her debut as Hermione Granger in the movie Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone alongside Daniel Radcliffe, Rupert Grint and Tom Felton. Not only did the movie have astounding criticism but audiences around the world instantly fell in love with her and her style, winning her the Young Artist Award for Leading Young

Actress in a Feature Film amongst many nominations. For a whole decade, she carried on playing the role of Hermione in the other 8 Harry Potter movies. Her talents have earned her many notable awards such as the People's Choice Awards for Favourite Dramatic Movie Actress, the MTV Trailblazer Award and many more. Throughout the years, she has also starred in other well-known and successful movies such as The Perks of Being a Wallflower, Disney's live-action Beauty and the Beast and the humorous comedies the Bling Ring and This Is the End. She had also begun partaking in the modelling and fashion industry. Additionally, certified in 2013, she began teaching yoga and meditation. Supplementary to her acting career, Watson decided to further pursue her education graduating Brown University in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in English literature.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The same year she was nominated as the "UN Goodwill Ambassador" addressing and advocating many present issues. By the age of 24, she had been promoting women's education. The young actress even travelled to Zambia and Bangladesh to further accomplish her goal. Watson served as an Ambassador Africa in for 'Camfed International' she where encouraged development of education in the rural areas of Africa where the poverty was significant. Her humanitarian work for the "United Nations Women's Rights" was honorable and made a mark in history. Watson captured numerous people's attention on the matter and her involvement became viral in the media. The actress was passionate about gender equality since she herself was a young girl. Therefore, she gained the title of activist.




Emma Watson stands proudly representing this campaign preparing the next generation's taking over of this legacy.
